When I mention “the unit block” of a street, this means the incident occurred at an address anywhere between 1 and 99 of the street.

Robberies

There was one robbery during the past week.

On Wednesday, 01-18-23, at approximately 5:00 p.m., a victim reported he was robbed in the parking lot of **Chase** bank on **Sullivan Avenue**. The victim stated he agreed to meet the suspect to purchase a Lexus IS 300. The victim test drove the vehicle with the suspect in the passenger seat from his home in San Francisco to the bank on Sullivan Avenue. The victim described this suspect as a light-skinned Black male, 5’2” tall, approximately 28 years old, with an earring in his left ear, and wearing a red jacket and black pants. Another suspect followed them in a white Mercedes-Benz as they drove to the bank. The victim described this suspect as a White female, 5’6” tall, 25-28 years old, and wearing a blue hoodie and nurse pants/scrubs. The victim and suspects entered the bank, the victim withdrew money, and all three walked out of the bank. The victim asked the male suspect to sign a title of transfer, but the suspect refused and then pulled out a black firearm. The suspect placed the front of the firearm on the victim’s stomach, told the victim to give him the money, reached inside the victim’s pocket, and grabbed \$3,100. Both suspects fled in the Mercedes-Benz. This investigation is continuing.

Residential Burglaries

There were three residential burglaries during the past week.

Between Monday, 01-16-23, at approximately 4:30 p.m., and Tuesday, 01-17-23, at approximately 1:45 p.m., at the 100 block of **Alta Vista Way**, residents came home and noticed their place

burglarized. The rear door appeared to have been pried, and the interior door jamb was broken. The garage door had its top slat broken off and removed. It is unknown at this time what items are stolen. This investigation is continuing.

On Saturday, 01-21-23, at approximately 11:04 p.m., officers were dispatched to the 200 block of **Bay Ridge Drive** on a report of a residential burglary in progress. Residents came home to find the kitchen window screen removed and the glass window opened by suspect(s). One of the residents saw a possible suspect, described as a thin male wearing a dark-colored hoodie, blue jeans, and black sneakers, walk out from between residences. The suspect was last seen walking on **Bay Ridge Drive** towards **Oriente Street**. The residents had \$30,000, ten Louis Vuitton purses valued at approximately \$40,000, social security cards, a green card, and a safe deposit key stolen. This investigation is continuing.

On Thursday, 01-19-23, at approximately 6:38 p.m., officers were dispatched to the unit block of **Como Avenue** on a report of a residential burglary. The victim stated that she came home and noticed the front door was locked; however, her bedroom door had pry marks. The victim said she used her key to open her bedroom door and noticed her pink backpack containing pens, notebooks, and a tablet valued at approximately \$50 was stolen.

Commercial Burglaries

There was one commercial burglary during the past week.

On Tuesday, 01-17-23, at approximately 6:00 a.m., on the unit block of **Midway Drive**, toolboxes stored in a parking garage were broken into. The suspect(s) stole various tools and equipment valued at approximately \$800. **Online report.

Vehicle Burglaries

There were six vehicle burglaries reported during the past week.

- Unit block of **San Juan Avenue** —a purse, wireless earbuds, and glasses were taken from a 2010 **Chrysler Town & Country**. The sliding door was found open, unknown method of entry by the suspect. The suspect was described as a slender short statured male wearing a black hooded sweatshirt and white pants. Occurred on 01-18-23 at approximately 1:55 a.m.
- Unit block of **Lausanne Avenue** —sunglasses and cologne were taken from a 2018 **Chevy Camaro**. The front windshield and side mirror were shattered by the suspects. The exterior of the vehicle was keyed. Occurred on 01-19-23 at approximately 8:54 a.m. A 20-year-old Walnut Creek resident was arrested and booked into jail for auto burglary, vandalism, and possession of controlled substances. Another suspect, an 18-year-old Walnut Creek resident, was arrested and booked into jail for auto burglary and vandalism.
- Parking lot of **In N Out Burger** on **Washington Street**—a backpack containing small tools and business cards was taken from a 2021 **Ford Explorer**. The rear passenger side window was smashed. Occurred on 01-19-23 between 11:37 a.m. and 12:00 p.m.
- **Monterey Drive** and **Higate Drive** —a wallet containing a driver's license and credit cards was taken from a 2010 **Audi Q5**. The front passenger window was smashed. Occurred between 1:00 p.m. on 01-20-23 and 10:30 a.m. on 01-21-23.
- **Saint Francis Square** —a driver's license, credit card, and clothes were taken from a 2015 **Toyota Camry**. The driver's side window was smashed. Occurred on 01-21-23 between 6:00 p.m. and 6:15 p.m. **Online report.

- **East Market Street and Price Street**—nothing was taken from a 2013 **Hyundai Elantra**. The right rear passenger window was shattered. Occurred between 6:30 p.m. on 01-22-23 and 5:00 p.m. on 01-23-23.
