When I mention “the unit block” of a street, this means the incident occurred at an address anywhere between 1 and 99 of the street.

Robberies

There was one robbery and two attempted robberies during the past week.

On Monday, 07-24-23, at approximately 12:35 p.m., officers were dispatched regarding a strong-arm robbery that occurred at **Morton Drive** and **Simpson Drive**. The victim stated as she was walking her dog, a black SUV stopped, a passenger exited and approached her. This suspect indicated she wanted to buy the victim’s jewelry. The victim informed the suspect that she didn’t want to sell her jewelry; therefore, the suspect began to grab the rings worn on her hands forcefully. The suspect also grabbed at the victim’s upper left arm. The victim pushed the suspect to stop the attack. The driver of the SUV said something to the suspect, which caused the suspect to get back into the car and drive away. Through investigation, both suspects were arrested later in the day at 2:15 p.m. The suspect who grabbed at the victim’s jewelry is a 38-year-old Sacramento resident. The driver of the vehicle is a 39-year-old Seattle resident. Both suspects were booked into jail for attempted robbery, conspiracy, and elder abuse.

On Monday, 07-24-23, at approximately 1:02 p.m., officers were dispatched to the parking lot of **Original Joe’s of Westlake** on a report of a strong-arm robbery. The victim stated that while he was sitting in his vehicle, a suspect exited a car and then proceeded to use a tool to strike his front passenger window about six times. The suspect’s car was parked directly behind the victim’s vehicle, which prevented the victim from driving away. The victim, in fear, exited his vehicle and ran through the parking lot. The suspect opened the front passenger door, took the victim’s backpack containing a MacBook Pro and miscellaneous documents, and drove away. The victim described the suspect as possibly a Filipino male wearing a black gator covering his lower face, a black hooded sweatshirt, and unknown-colored pants. Later, officers were able to locate the backpack, but the MacBook Pro worth \$3,000 was gone.

On Monday, 07-24-23, between 7:45 p.m. and 8:00 p.m., on the unit block of **Garwood Drive**, three suspects attempted to rob a victim while he was walking. The victim got off the bus and noticed three suspects. He was wary of the suspects and tried to walk behind them. Once the victim got to Garwood Drive, two of the three suspects approached him and demanded money. The victim said he did not have money and that he was able to fight them off. The suspects ran away towards Hillside Boulevard. The victim described the first suspect as possibly a Hispanic male with a thin build, 5'9" tall, and wearing a black ski mask, dark hooded sweatshirt, and blue jeans. The second suspect was described as possibly a Hispanic male with a stocky build, 6'2" tall, and wearing a black ski mask and all dark clothing. The third suspect was described as possibly a Hispanic male with a heavy set build, 6'0" tall, and wearing a black ski mask, dark hooded sweatshirt, and gray sweatpants.

Residential Burglaries

There was one attempted residential burglary during the past week.

On Thursday, 07-27-23, between 8:25 p.m. and 10:00 p.m., a suspect attempted to enter a residence on the unit block of **Morton Drive**. The victims noticed the front door lock had been pried; however, the suspect could not gain entry due to the secured deadbolt. **Online report.

Commercial Burglaries

There were two commercial burglaries during the past week.

On Wednesday, 07-26-23, at approximately 4:24 a.m., officers were dispatched to the **Food Mart** at the **Exxon Gas Station**, located on the 4600 block of **Callan Boulevard**, on a report of a broken glass door. A suspect used a large rock to smash the glass door to gain entry at a time prior to 4:23 a.m. The suspect took \$200 from a cash drawer and attempted to access an ATM. This investigation is continuing.

On Friday, 07-28-23, between 2:49 a.m. and 3:16 a.m., multiple companies at a construction site located on the unit block of **Midway Drive** was a victim of a commercial burglary when suspect(s) drove a white truck inside the gate, stole approximately \$15,000 worth of tools, and drove away.

Vehicle Burglaries

There were five vehicle burglaries during the past week.

- Parking lot of **Serramonte Shopping Center**—clothing and shoes were taken from a 2012 **Honda CRV**. The back window was smashed. Occurred on 07-24-23 between 5:00 p.m. and 7:15 p.m.
- Parking lot of **In-N-Out Burger** on **Gellert Boulevard**—a black backpack containing a passport, travel documents, two Apple laptops, and miscellaneous electronics was taken from a 2022 **BMW X3**. The passenger window was smashed. Occurred on 07-29-23 at approximately 1:00 p.m.
- Unit block of **Sheffield Drive**—a white crate containing mail was taken from a **U.S. Postal Service Truck**. The front driver's side window was smashed. Occurred on 07-29-23 at approximately 4:34 p.m.
- 1100 block of **87th Street**—power tools were taken from a 2022 **Toyota Tundra**. The front driver's side window was smashed. Occurred on 07-30-23 at approximately 4:00 a.m.

- 1100 block of **North Mayfair Avenue**—tools were taken from a 2012 **Ford Transit**. The unknown suspect opened the trunk. Occurred on 07-30-23 at approximately 4:40 a.m.
