When I mention “the unit block” of a street, this means the incident occurred at an address anywhere between 1 and 99 of the street.

Robberies

There were four robberies during the past week.

On Friday, 10-06-23, at approximately 9:52 a.m., officers were dispatched to the 100 block of **Abbot Avenue** on a report of an assault. A suspect had wrestled a \$400 key from a postal worker and fled in a black Hyundai Veloster. The postal worker described the suspect as a Hispanic male, 5’10” to 6’0” tall, and 20 to 25 years old. This investigation is continuing.

On Friday, 10-06-23, at approximately 12:45 p.m., an officer was at the **Westlake Shopping Center** and flagged down by a **Target** security guard. The security guard stated a suspect selected merchandise and proceeded to the self-checkout. The suspect paid for some items and began to take an unpaid flashlight, razor blade, and luggage, all worth approximately \$80. The security guard approached the suspect, and the suspect brandished the razor blade toward the security guard. The security guard stepped away, and the suspect left the store. The security guard described the suspect as a Black male with a beard wearing a gray sweatshirt.

On Saturday, 10-07-23, at approximately 3:24 p.m., officers were dispatched to **Nordstrom Rack** on a report of a robbery. A loss prevention agent said a suspect entered the store with empty bags, concealed merchandise valued at approximately \$140 in one of the empty bags, and exited the store without paying for the merchandise. When loss prevention agents tried to stop the suspect, the suspect bit one of them. The suspect had metal knuckles, fentanyl, and metal foil with straws in his possession. The suspect, a 28-year-old Vacaville resident, was arrested and booked into jail for robbery, possession of brass knuckles, possession of fentanyl, and possession of drug paraphernalia.

On Sunday, 10-08-23, at approximately 3:47 p.m., officers were dispatched to **Walgreens on Mission Street** on a report of a strong-arm robbery. A suspect entered the store and took 36 boxes of trash bags valued at approximately \$320. When the security guard asked the suspect to stop, he said the suspect punched him in the mouth and left the store. A manager said after the suspect left the store, the suspect boarded a bus headed northbound. The manager described the suspect as a heavyset Black male, 5'11" to 6'1" tall, late 50s to early 60s, with gray hair. This investigation is continuing.

Residential Burglaries

There were no residential burglaries during the past week.

Commercial Burglaries

There were two commercial burglaries during the past week.

On Saturday, 10-07-23, at approximately 12:50 a.m., officers were dispatched to **Deca Co Property Management** on the unit block of **Station Avenue** on a report of a commercial burglary in progress. A security guard stated that he was patrolling the building, and as he opened a door, he heard a male scream and was struck with a three-foot metal or wooden object. The security guard closed the door, locked it, and ran away. The security guard believed the suspect was still inside the building. Officers checked the building and a second building and could not locate the suspect.

On Monday, 10-09-23, at approximately 4:04 p.m., an officer was dispatched to the unit block of **Parnell Avenue** on a report of a burglary that occurred between Saturday, 10-07-23, and Monday, 10-09-23. The victim said she noticed her shed was unlocked, and a suspect took a \$300 stained glass lamp.

Vehicle Burglaries

There were two vehicle burglaries during the past week.

- **Saint Francis Boulevard and Clarinada Avenue**—tools were taken from a 1996 **GMC** pickup truck. The passenger window was broken. Occurred on 10-07-23 at approximately 12:45 a.m. The suspect vehicle was an Infinity SUV, which was a reported stolen vehicle. Officers located the Infinity and saw a suspect exit the vehicle and run. The suspect was eventually located and apprehended by officers from a neighboring department on Kent Court. Inside the Infinity were numerous stolen items. The suspect had methamphetamine inside the coin pocket of his pants. The suspect, a 48-year-old Oakland resident, was arrested and booked into jail for vehicle burglary, possession of stolen property, possession of a stolen vehicle, resisting arrest, and possession of a controlled substance.
- Parking lot of **Original Joe's** on **Glenwood Avenue**—a backpack containing a laptop was taken from a 2022 **Jeep Grand Cherokee**. The rear passenger side trunk window and the back trunk window were smashed. Occurred on 10-08-23 at approximately 10:25 a.m.

Stolen Vehicles

There were three stolen vehicles and three attempted stolen vehicles during the past week. Two vehicles were recovered.

- **Gambetta Street and Abbot Avenue**—a 2020 **Jeep Grand Cherokee**. Occurred between 9:00 p.m. on 10-02-23 and 7:00 a.m. on 10-03-23.

- Parking lot of **24 Hour Fitness** on **Gellert Boulevard**—a 2012 **Honda Fit**. Occurred on 10-08-23 between 1:45 p.m. and 3:05 p.m. **Recovered on 10-11-23 by SFPD.
- Unit block of **Fleetwood Drive**—a 2023 **Chevrolet Camaro**. Occurred on 10-08-23 at approximately 5:30 p.m. A suspect exited a dark gray Lexus, entered the Camaro, and drove off. The victim attempted to follow the suspect. While fleeing, the suspect got into a collision at John Daly Boulevard and Lake Merced Boulevard before driving off. **Recovered on 10-10-23 by Oakland PD. This investigation is continuing.
- Unit block of **Castlemont Avenue**—an attempted theft of a 1983 **Honda Motorcycle**. Occurred on 10-04-23 at approximately 3:44 a.m.
- 300 block of **Lake Merced Boulevard**—an attempted theft of a 2013 **Hyundai Accent**. Occurred on 10-04-23 at approximately 7:42 p.m. The front driver's side window was broken, and the steering column was ripped off.
- Parking lot of **Cow Palace** on **Martin Street**—an attempted theft of a 2021 **Dodge Challenger**. Occurred on 10-08-23 at approximately 8:38 a.m. The suspect said she entered a vehicle and tried to start it. If successful, she would drive off with the vehicle, stop at a couple of places, and then return the vehicle. The suspect, a 50-year-old San Francisco resident, was arrested and booked into jail for attempted vehicle theft.

Miscellaneous

- There were 157 cases taken.
- There were 8 domestic disturbance cases reported.
- There were 5 cases involving an involuntary psychiatric hold.
- There were 8 malicious mischief/vandalism cases reported.
- There were 0 cases for public intoxication.
- There were 2 hit-and-run collisions reported.
- There were 10 narcotics-related cases taken.
