



# Crime Alert and Community Update Bulletin

When I mention “the unit block” of a street, this means the incident occurred at an address anywhere between 1 and 99 of the street.

## Robberies

There were two robberies during the past week.

On Tuesday, 10-24-23, at approximately 4:51 p.m., an officer was dispatched to **Punji Liquors at Skyline Plaza** on a report of a theft. One of the owners said when she returned to the store, she noticed a suspect loitering in front of the cash register. The owner then saw a second suspect concealing approximately \$100 worth of alcoholic beverages into a backpack. A third suspect was standing next to the second suspect, acting as a “lookout.” The owner walked towards both the second and third suspects, but the first suspect blocked her path and pushed her twice in the chest. The second suspect attempted to flee the store with the backpack of alcohol. The owner grabbed the strap of the backpack, and the second suspect held onto the backpack. Moments later, the first suspect proceeded to forcibly rip the backpack from the owner’s grasp, and they fled the store across the parking lot. The owners described the first suspect as a teenage male wearing a mask, a hooded sweatshirt with the hood over his head, and blue jeans with multiple tears. The second suspect was described as a teenage Hispanic female with long brown hair, carrying a multi-colored backpack, and wearing a black hoodie, white tee shirt, blue jeans, and black sunglasses. The third suspect was described as a teenage Hispanic female with long brown hair wearing a black long-sleeve shirt and blue jeans.

On Wednesday, 10-25-23, at approximately 5:58 p.m., an officer was dispatched to the parking lot of **Walgreens on Mission Street** on a report of a robbery. The victim said while she was on her way to Walgreens, a male suspect grabbed her iPhone 13 worth approximately \$1,100 from her hand and fled.

## Residential Burglaries

There was one residential burglary during the past week.

On Thursday, 10-26-23, between 12:00 p.m. and 4:00 p.m., a residence on the unit block of **Fernwood Avenue** was broken into by an unknown suspect. The suspect broke the lock knob on a rear door that leads to the garage and took a tablet worth approximately \$100.

## Commercial Burglaries

There were two commercial burglaries during the past week.

On Monday, 10-23-23, at approximately 5:50 p.m., a suspect entered **24 Hour Fitness** on **Gellert Boulevard** and broke into a locker. The suspect stole a wallet with cash, credit cards, and car keys, all worth approximately \$250. \*\*Online report.

On Sunday, 10-29-23, at approximately 3:53 a.m., officers were dispatched to **City Toyota** on **San Pero Road** on a report of a burglary. Three unknown suspects broke a window, damaged key boxes, and took keys worth approximately \$27,500. This investigation is continuing.

## Vehicle Burglaries

There were two vehicle burglaries during the past week.

- **Crocker Avenue** and **South Hill Boulevard**—purse containing credit cards, ID cards, passport card, medical insurance card, house keys, and \$250 was taken from a 2008 **Toyota Highlander**. The front passenger window was broken. Occurred on 10-23-23 between 12:10 p.m. and 12:55 p.m.
- 400 block of **Accacia Street**—nothing was taken from a 2023 **Kia Soul**. The rear passenger window was broken. Occurred between 12:45 p.m. on 10-28-23 and 9:30 a.m. on 10-29-23. This is the same vehicle mentioned below in the Stolen Vehicles section.

## Stolen Vehicles

There were four stolen vehicles and two attempted stolen vehicles during the past week. One vehicle was recovered.

- Unit block of **Hampshire Avenue**—a 2005 **BMW M3**. Occurred between 8:30 p.m. on 10-24-23 and 1:00 a.m. on 10-25-23.
- Unit block of **Lausanne Avenue**—a 2013 **Volkswagen Beetle**. Occurred on 10-26-23 at approximately 4:30 a.m.
- Parking garage on the 1800 block of **Junipero Serra Boulevard**—a 2017 **Hyundai Santa Fe**. Occurred on 10-28-23 between 1:30 p.m. and 4:45 p.m.
- 500 block of **Niantic Avenue**—a 2016 **Kia Soul**. Occurred on 10-28-23 at approximately 9:01 p.m. \*\*Recovered by BART PD on 10-31-23.
- 400 block of **Accacia Street**—an attempted theft of a 2023 **Kia Soul**. Occurred between 12:45 p.m. on 10-28-23 and 9:30 a.m. on 10-29-23. The steering column was damaged, the ignition was

punched, the wiper washer signal switch lever was broken off, and the vehicle alarm module was tampered with. This is the same vehicle mentioned above in the Vehicle Burglaries section.

- 800 block of **King Drive**—an attempted theft of a 2011 **Kia Soul**. Occurred between 10:00 p.m. on 10-28-23 and 1:23 p.m. on 10-29-23. The lower steering wheel and key assembly were broken. \*\*Online report.

## Miscellaneous

- There were 151 cases taken.
- There were 12 domestic disturbance cases reported.
- There were 3 cases involving an involuntary psychiatric hold.
- There were 10 malicious mischief/vandalism cases reported.
- There were 2 cases for public intoxication.
- There were 2 hit-and-run collisions reported.
- There were 13 narcotics-related cases taken.

This private network ensures that only those who live in your neighborhood can join; users must go through a verification process. I like the fact that the site verifies users by addresses, and it won't allow people to access a neighborhood if they don't live there.
