When I mention “the unit block” of a street, this means the incident occurred at an address anywhere between 1 and 99 of the street.

Robberies

There were two robberies during the past week.

On Wednesday, 11-01-23, between 7:00 p.m. and 7:30 p.m., at the **Kentucky Fried Chicken** parking lot at **Skyline Plaza**, a victim met a suspect and entered a van to purchase marijuana. After the victim communicated he did not want to purchase any marijuana, another suspect in the front passenger seat turned around and pointed a gun at the victim. The victim was robbed of his gold necklace, iPhone 14, and wallet, all worth approximately \$30,500. This investigation is continuing.

On Thursday, 11-02-23, at approximately 2:50 p.m., officers were dispatched to **Lucky Supermarket** on **Mission Street** on a report of a robbery. A manager stated that he saw two suspects enter the store with large empty bags. Both suspects placed laundry detergents in their respective shopping carts. The manager approached one of the suspects and asked the suspect to leave the merchandise. The suspect responded with, “Stay away, or else I’m going to f*ck you up.” The suspect went to another aisle, where the manager grabbed the shopping cart and demanded the suspect to leave. The suspect pushed the shopping cart toward the manager, which caused the manager to fall to the ground. While the manager was on the ground, the suspect kicked him in the face. The manager said he was also dragged by the shopping cart, and his fingers were caught, which caused injury to his hand. Both suspects fled the store, heading south on Mission Street with approximately \$290 worth of stolen detergent. Officers eventually located and arrested both suspects. The suspect who kicked the manager, a 31-year-old San Francisco resident, was arrested and booked into jail for robbery, conspiracy to commit a crime, and outstanding warrants. The other suspect, a 27-year-old San Francisco resident, was arrested and booked into jail for burglary, conspiracy to commit a crime, and an outstanding warrant.

Residential Burglaries

There were no residential burglaries during the past week.

Commercial Burglaries

There was one commercial burglary during the past week.

Vehicle Burglaries

There were two vehicle burglaries during the past week.

- Parking garage on the 1900 block of **Junipero Serra Boulevard**—backpack with school supplies was taken from a 2012 **Hyundai Elantra**. The rear passenger window was broken. Occurred on 11-04-23 between 7:30 p.m. and 10:10 p.m. The backpack with its contents was located in a trash can in an adjacent parking garage.
